Apavilion is rising at Woodlands Conservancy, the former Woodlands Trail and Park, in Belle Chasse. The park, which straddles Plaquemines and Orleans parishes, is one of the last remaining coastal forests in Southeast Louisiana and features more than 12 miles of trails. The 12-foot-by-24-foot pavilion will be at the entrance to the park and will be used by visiting groups and individuals for educational and recreational purposes. The pavilion should be completed in February.
